

Travelers to an Unimaginable Land: Stories of Dementia, the Caregiver, and the Human Brain by Dasha Kiper

According to medical estimates, 10% of the U.S. population over 65 has one form of dementia or another rising to 13% by age 70, and 22% has early cognitive decline. Families are by far the caregivers for individuals with some stage of dementia and cognitive decline. The impacts on our families, our friends, and community are profound. In this book, Dasha Kiper tells a clear, compassionate, understandable, story of not only those that suffer from dementia, but, most importantly perhaps, the less known struggle of the caregivers who travel the road with them. Helping to understand the complex, often lifelong bond of experience and expectations, and how those are impacted by dementia is terribly important for individuals, and communities, to understand. This book goes a very long way to helping caregivers not lose their own way by understanding what is happening both in the minds of their loved ones, and in their own as well.
